What is HIB?

(Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying)

A subset aggressive behavior which:

- 1. Is intentional and deliberately harmful
- 2. Is motivated by perceived characteristics:
 - a. Race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, mental/physical/sensory disability, or any other distinguishing characteristic.
- 3. HIB Bullying can be the following types of behaviors:
 - a. Gestures
 - b. Written, verbal, or physical act
 - c. Electronic communication

What defines HIB?

1. <u>Perceived Characteristic</u>-hair color, eye color, skin color, socio-economic status, race, gender, sexual orientation, etc.

2. **School Property:** Takes place on school property, school sponsored function, school bus or off school grounds (this includes summer)

- 3. **Intent**: Disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school **AND**
 - A reasonable person should know, under the circumstances, will have the effect of physically or emotionally harming a student or damaging the student's property, or placing a student reasonable fear of physical or emotional harm **OR**
 - b. Has the effect of insulting or demeaning any student or group of students **OR**
 - c. Creates a hostile educational environment for the student by interfering with a student's education

Arguments or altercations between peers **What** Name calling **Bullying is Physical fights** NOT **Teasing** Conflict

Educating all Stakeholders on the Law/Prevention

- Parents: Back to School Night, night time events, communication with teachers and administration
- <u>Students</u>: Character education, school wide events, assemblies, classroom discussion
- Staff/Administration: Attend workshops and trainings

Week of Respect

The law designates the week beginning the first Monday in October of each year as a "Week of Respect" in New Jersey. School districts are directed to observe the week by providing age-appropriate instruction focusing on preventing harassment, intimidation, or bullying.

How to report

- -HIB activity communicated to staff, **Anti-Bullying Specialist/ Principal** alerted within 24 hours.
- -Written Report produced within 2 days of Verbal.
- -Investigation is run over 10 day period, HIB Investigation Report is submitted to **District**Anti-Bullying Specialist.
- -HIB Investigation is reviewed by School Board, findings are reported to parents.

What is I&RS?

(Intervention & Referral Services)

- -I&RS is a support system for teachers to assist students who are experiencing learning, behavior, or health difficulties in general education.
- -The committee may consist of; School Administration, a CST team member, General and/or Special Education Teacher, School Nurse, Interventionists, or any other Related Services Personnel.
- -Parents are invited to I&RS meetings, the committee develops an intervention plan that may provide alternative strategies, programs, and/or assessments to support the student in achieving success within the general education program.

What is the purpose of an I&RS Committee?

- -Address academic, behavior, and health difficulties to support student learning.
- -Analyze data collected by staff on the identified learning and behavioral difficulties of students.
- -Develop Action Plans, by providing interventions based on specific goals.
- -Actively involve parents/guardians in the development and implementation of an action plan.
- -Review and assess effectiveness of each plan, and adjust goals based on growth.

Intervention & Referral Services

- -First, communication with **Teacher** regarding area of concern.
- After attempting suggested supports, **Teacher** submits *I&RS Referral*.
- -Case Manager is assigned, <u>Initial I&RS Meeting</u> scheduled/held, **I&RS Team** creates a goal and *Action Plan*.

Goal is supported with strategies that are tracked. *Action Plan* is reviewed ~8 weeks later at I&RS Review Meeting.

-At the <u>I&RS Review Meeting</u> goals are reviewed, new goals are assigned, data is provided for Action Plan to be updated.

-Process continues to support staff, student, and track data/record of successful interventions.

Responsive Classroom®

 - A way of teaching that creates a safe, challenging, and joyful classroom and schoolwide climate for all students.

 - Morning Meetings provide opportunities to teach specific skills for all students to participate successfully in their classrooms.

What is Title I

Under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the U.S. Department of Education (DOE) provides supplemental funding to Title I schools to meet the needs of students. The purpose of this funding is "to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments," (Title I - Improving The Academic Achievement Of The Disadvantaged, 2005).



Parents Rights Under Title I

Parents have the right to know the teaching qualifications of their child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO KNOW

- Whether the teacher/paraprofessional has met the professional qualifications and licensing criteria in the subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- How the school will implement the district/school parent involvement requirements as required by Section 1118(a)(2) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and opportunities for parental input
- The commitment from the school, the parent, and the student (School-Parent Compact) to share and revise the responsibility for improved academic achievement.


